EIPS Code of Ethics

1) Independence and neutrality

The EIPS is an independent, non-profit organisation composed solely of ESCP students and alumni. Our reporting is neither directed nor constrained by our stakeholders – Editorial decisions are taken collectively during our monthly newsroom meeting to encourage open dialogue and democratically determined coverage. The society aims through its editorial process to provide the most transparent reporting and give readers wide-ranging viewpoints for them to independently form their opinions on a given topic.

2) Original content

The EIPS publishes only original content that is directly written by our analysts team or by approved outside contributors.

3) Transparent sourcing

In the spirit of truthfulness and impartiality, the EIPS provides any reader the entire list of sources in the “References” drop-down menu at the end of each piece. All information cited in our publications is supported by reliable sources – either from prominent news outlets or academic/scientific journals – and can be verified transparently by following the in-text reference number put in brackets.

4) Corrections and complaints

If readers notice a factual error, misrepresentation of facts or any omission of data, we encourage them to contact our editorial team by mail (**Chief Editor:** maxime.achille.berna.pierre@edu.escp.eu, **Editors:** jules.rouvreau@edu.escp.eu, oriane.beveraggi@edu.escp.eu, felix.dube@edu.escp.eu). The corrections will be made promptly. Any post-publication editing will be notified transparently below the main body text and above the references.

5) AI and plagiarism

The EIPS values original content that has neither been partially nor fully generated by Generative Artificial Intelligence (GAI). AI tools are exclusively used during the editing process to spot and adjust inconsistencies in formatting before publication. If it is used in any other cases, readers will be explicitly informed.

Any content published undergoes thorough due diligence to ensure the work is original, and if other sources are used, that they are referenced and quoted properly.

6) Opinion pieces

To ensure total freedom of speech and thought, in the spirit of strict apoliticism, every opinion is welcome as long as it is backed by verifiable facts. However, opinions do not engage the society but its analysts.
